Lacemakers of Puget Sound will host a Lace Day for members of local lace guilds and area needlework groups. This free event, which includes a buffet-style tea, will be held from 1:30 p.m. to 5 p.m., on Saturday, October 26, 2013, at Kent Commons, Green River Room, 525 Fourth Avenue North, Kent, Washington 98032. At 2:30 p.m., Nancy Evans, of Lace Legacy, will present a program, "Home Care and Laundering of Your Linens and Laces." Nancy is an avid needle-lace maker known for her deep knowledge of lace and her involvement in L.A.C.E. (Lace Arts Council for Education), a Pacific Northwest group that meets regularly to study lace history, preservation and conservation.

LPS members will bring their projects to work on during the event; attendees may try their hand at bobbin lacemaking, tatting, knitting or crocheted lace and needle lace. Admire the skill and beauty of vintage- to modern- hand-worked lace in the lace displays. The following vendors will be on location:
