Tonder, Flanders, Schneeberger, or s'Gravensmoer

Tønder Bobbin Lace

Tønder is a fine Danish point ground lace. Basic bobbin lace skills are needed along with an ability to read diagrams. Familiarity with point ground would be a plus.

Flanders Bobbin Lace

Flanders is a lovely lace with a background that looks like a caned chair seat and dense linen motifs outlined by a gimp. Basic bobbin lace skills required along with an ability to read diagrams.

Schneeberger Bobbin Lace

Schneeberer is a bobbin lace with very few pairs that uses whole stitch, linen stitch, braids, picots, and lots of sewings to make small decorative motifs. Basic bobbin lace skills required.

s'Gravensmoer Bobbin Lace

s'Gravensmoer is a Dutch lace best know for its unusual half stitch. Participants will choose from beginning level patterns to create a bookmark or a small motif. Basic bobbin lace skills required along with an ability to read diagrams.

Tatting: Primrose Necklace/Amulet Bag Karey Solomon, Instructor \$35.00

Lots of beads get organized into a tassel and amulet bag just large enough to hold a handkerchief and a little mad money (or, of course, an amulet). This pattern may be tatted in one piece with one shuttle and a ball thread that holds all the beads until you need them. Size 10, 15 or 20 thread may be used. Students will need to know rings and chains. You will learn one way to tat a stuffed "bauble" and tassel, lock chains and how to handle lots of beads. Come with your no. 10 seed beads pre-threaded and plan on tatting mostly chains. You'll have fun, and leave wearing your new necklace.

Orenburg Lace Knitting

Learn the traditional way of knitting an Orenburg shawl while knitting a beautiful triangular shawl from laceweight yarn. The shawl is knit in garter stitch and filled with the typical lace motifs of Orenburg, like the pea and honeycomb motifs. In order to get into the body of this shawl, there will be homework that must be done before the class.

The shawl is knitted using a laceweight yarn at approximately 630 yards/50 grams or 1260 yards/100 grams. You will need around 630 yards. The yarn in the original pattern, Cassiopeiae, can be purchased from http://www.darkstarz.us/store.html and you need 2 skeins. The magazine can be purchased at http://www.interweavestore.com/knitting-traditions-fall-2014-grouped or the individual pattern can be downloaded at http://www.interweavestore.com/classic-gossamer-triangular-shawlpattern.

Homework: Please have knit the set up rows of the Edging chart once, and then rows 1-16 of the edging chart 23 times before class.

Beginning Tatting

Learn the basics of this lovely art of lacemaking with only a shuttle and thread. Rings, picots, & joining are among the techniques you will learn when making this very portable art. You will need a tatting shuttle, 2 balls of size 8 pearl cotton – 1 white and 1 contrasting color. A small crochet hook for joining picots and scissor are helpful. Note: Any cotton thread will do but pearl cotton is preferred as it slips easily.
